

Class Hours: This course will have 72 class hours, including 40 lecture hours, 10 lecturer office hours, 10-hour TA discussion sessions, 2-hour review sessions, 10-hour extra classes.

Course Description:

Intermediate Korean is designed for students who have basic knowledge of the Korean language. Emphasis is placed on the fundamentals of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. In addition, students will become familiar with the language and cultural background of everyday life situations likely to be encountered in contemporary Korean society.





The objective of the course is to equip students with communicative skills in speaking, reading, and writing at the intermediate level in Korean. At the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. carry on a conversation on a variety of topics that are familiar to them;
- 2. understand the main ideas and supporting ideas when people talk about familiar topics;
- 3. understand short, simple readings on familiar topics; and
- 4. write a series of simple sentences on topics of interest.

Grading & Evaluation:

Students will be scored on the following:
