Class Hours:

This course will have 72 class hours, including 50 lecture hours, 10 instructor office hours, 10-hour TA discussion sessions, 2-hour review sessions.

Course Description:

This course is designed for students who have had no or very little knowledge of Korean. The course emphasizes the development of basic communication skills through intensive exercise and practice of sample patterns of dialogue and basic grammar. Emphasis is placed on the fundamentals of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. In addition, students will be exposed to everyday life contexts (e.g., language use, culture, etc.) likely to be encountered in contemporary Korean society.



Student Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course, students will be able to communicate with Korean native speakers at basic everyday survival tasks including self-introduction, expressing daily activities, talking about past events, asking and answering questions, counting numbers, giving directions, expressing needs, and making requests.

Course Requirement

1. Attendance and participation (30%)

Attendance check will be strictly enforced. In order to fully benefit from this class, students must attend all class sessions, arrive on time, and be prepared and attentive. A student will be marked late if they arrive after the start of class. Being late 3 times will be counted as 1 absence.

2. Quizzes (20%)

Quizzes will be given after finishing each lesson. The Instructor can give pop-quizzes at their discretion. There are no make-up quizzes, regardless of the reason even with a doctor's note. No partial credit (half-points) or extra credit points will be given on quizzes.

3. Tests (30%)

Students must take examination on the scheduled date. Students are not permitted to take make-up exams, without a valid medical note written by a doctor certifying a student could not physically attend the exam. Notes from pharmacies or receipts from hospitals are not acceptable excuses. The make-up exam will be taken within one week of the actual test date (any later and the student will receive a zero) and the highest grade for make-up exams is 90% of the total grade.

4. Homework (20%)

The final course grade will be standard, and will not be based on a curve.
