Course Description: In this course, macroeconomic models will be used as a framework for analyzing the determination of the level of national output and for explaining fluctuations in employment, the price level, interest rates, productivity, and the rate of economic growth. Additionally, the extent to which, and exactly in what ways, fiscal and monetary policies affect overall macroeconomic performance will be appraised.

- Calculate various macroeconomic indicators, multipliers, solve various economic models namely the IS-LM model, and the IS-LM-PC model.
- Apply the course materials to historical and current macroeconomic problems.
