Course Description:

This course examines the development of the American economy from colonial time to the present. Topics include changes in institutions, standards of living, income distributions, social mobility, labor markets, demographic structure, technological development, and the financial system. The course will be divided into three components: (1) Long run trends in the American economy, (2) the history of American labor, and (3) studies of some specific sectors of the American economy (finance, transportation, etc.).

Required Textbooks:

An Economic History of the United States by Mark V. Siegler.

Lectures:

Lectures are designed to clearly explain the concepts covered in the handouts and how they apply to real world situations. Lectures will be asynchronous and pre-recorded and posted online (LMS) or emailed to the class. Outlines of the lecture notes will be made available to students online or via emails.

Assignments:

Assignments will be posted online or emailed to students.

Paper:

Students will choose a specific topic of interest and write to analyze in the paper. The paper must be a sustained piece of writing and not purely descriptive. It should be properly documented, and
