Class Hours:

This course will have 52 class hours, including 32 lecture hours, professor 8 office hours, 8-hour TA discussion sessions, 4-hour review sessions.

Course Description:

This course examines the history of twentieth-century art in Europe and America. We will look closely at major figures and their work and pay special attention to the ideas, philosophies, and ideologies that shaped their language of visual expression. This line of inquiry will cast sharp light on the issue of pictorial abstraction, on the formation and character of different artistic movements, and on the “crisis of modernity.” By the end of the course, we will come to see abstraction itself as a type of philosophical system that was designed to address what early twentieth-century intellectuals saw as the most pressing concerns of their time.

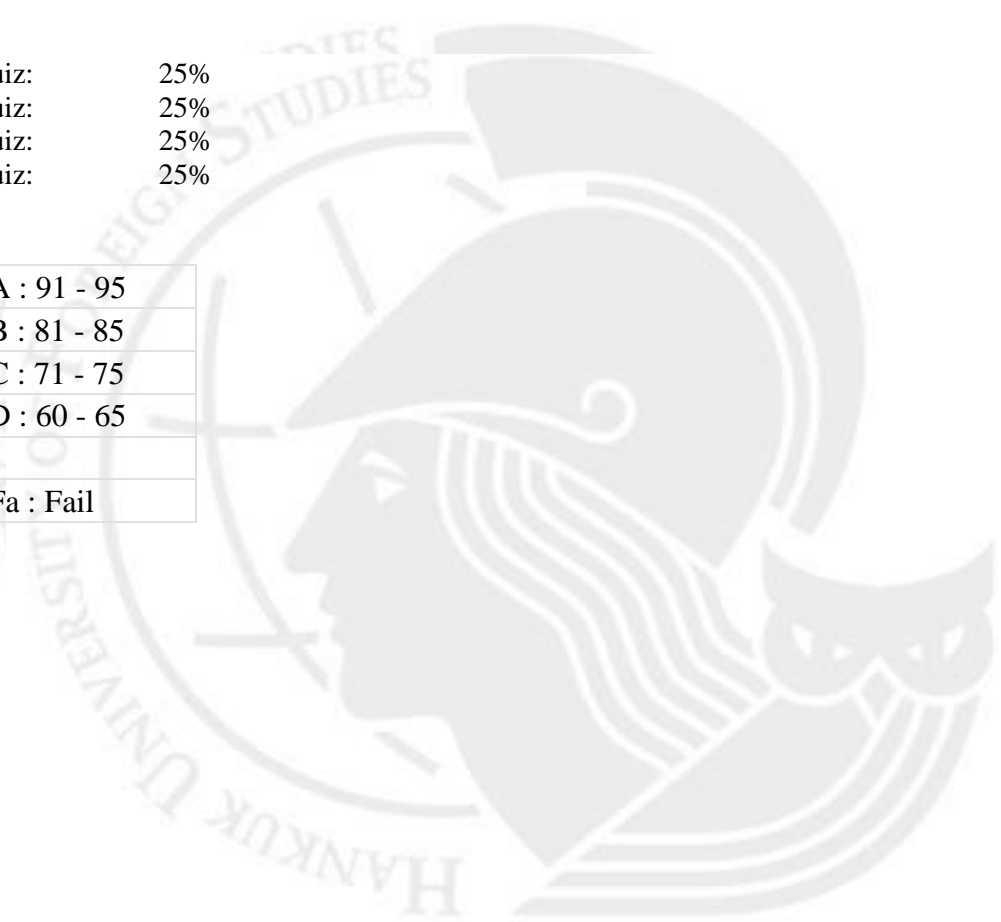

Quiz Format

The format for all exams will be the same:

Section 1: Multiple Choice, True/False, and Short Answer Questions

These questions will be drawn directly from the Supplementary Videos, Class Lectures, and the Textbook Readings.

Section 2: Art and Theory Essay

In so many respects, this class explores the intersections of modernist art and theory. We analyze works of art, read theoretical documents, and approach the language of pictorial form and color as a system of philosophical communication. The essays that feature in each weekly quiz engage with this same set of concerns.

The Art and Theory Essays require that you select one art-object affiliated with our readings from Chipp’s *Theories of Modern Art*. This means that you’re selecting an art-object affiliated with a particular movement (e.g. Expressionism, Cubism, De Stijl). Your goal is to analyze your chosen work of art, connecting the artist’s handling of form and color to the ideas that also find expression in our theoretical readings.

For each weekly essay, you are free to select any work of art that we discuss in class, so long as that work is affiliated with our readings from Chipp’s *Theories of Modern Art*. Please direct any questions to me via email.

Late Submission Policy:

Late quizzes will be accepted with penalty (unless there are extenuating circumstances). The late penalty is 10pts/day for the first five days. After that period, late exams can be submitted for half credit.
